Homework collaboration policy: You must write answers in your own words and do computer exercises on with your own hands at your preferred Internet connection. **You may collaborate provided that you give attribution to your collaborators and include working hyperlinks to their blogs in your own blog posts.**

1. Go to <http://creativecommons.org/about/licenses/meet-the-licenses> and think about how you would like to govern others' use of the material that you post on your Blogger blog. In class we used the Attribution Share-Alike license. Do you prefer anything else to that license? You do not need to write or submit anything for this question; just think about it.
2. Use <http://creativecommons.org/license/> to generate HTML for the license you have chosen. Edit the template of your Blogger blog so that the license appears in the sidebar, header, or footer of your Blogger blog.
3. Add at least one bookmark to the Bookmarks by CS-103 group. Use any title, description, and tags that you think appropriate. Be sure to include "HW3" as one of the tags for each of your new bookmarks.
4. Peruse the websites your classmates have shared on the Bookmarks by CS-103 group. Select at least two of them to add to your own personal set of bookmarks. Do this by using the red "Add to My Bookmarks" link. Note that "Add to My Bookmarks" only works for bookmarks that you didn't create in the first place.
5. Write at least two new posts on your Blogger.com blog.
  - a. One new post must include a description in your own words of which Creative Commons license you have chosen and why. This post must also include
    - i. a hyperlink to the appropriate sub-page of <http://creativecommons.org>,
    - ii. at least two different fonts
  - b. The second new post must say something about the bookmarks that you chose to add from question #4. This post must include
    - i. hyperlinks to the selected websites,
    - ii. an HTML list (either ordered or unordered)

**Friday Sept 29 we will log on to "Bookmarks by CS-103" during lecture, look at "All Bookmarks," and sort them by "Most Popular." Whoever posted the most popular bookmark will get to drop the lowest **TWO** homeworks from their class grade (as opposed to just the lowest homework).**
